From the Baltimore Chronicle. THE NEW TREASURY CIRCULAR. The people of the United States will be sure, believe with hesitation and difficulty, that the annexed circular was issued, in serious and sober earnest, from the Treasury of the United States. We assure them, however, that such is the fact. The original addressed to one of the first houses in this city, is now before us, signed with the name of Levi Woodbury, in his own proper handwriting. As originally drawn it was designed to be addressed to the Banks, but the purpose being changed, the words "your Bank" are erased and the word "you" substituted.

THE TREASURY DEPARTMENT. On the 23rd of September, 1837, the President of the United States, to cause the issue of Treasury Notes for such sum or sums as he may think expedient, but not exceeding in the whole amount of notes issued by such twelve full months of dollars and of denominations of not less than one hundred dollars for any one note, to be reimbursed at the Treasury of the U. States, after the expiration of one year from the date of the said notes respectively. I will thank you to state whether the contents of the annexed circular agree to take the said notes from the Government, and give the Treasurer of the United States a credit for the amount; to be drawn for as may be necessary, and payable in specie if required, and if so, to state what amount you will receive, and the latest rate of interest to be paid on said notes.
