COMMERCE OF THE UNITED STATES. According to the customhouse returns of the Treasury Department, recently published, the value of imports during the year ending Sept. 30, 1836, was \$112,717,404, being twenty-seven millions less than during the year 1835, and seven millions less than during the year 1834, and a year of the greatest expansion, that preceded a depression of specie payments.

The falling off in the exports has not been so great. The total value of every description of goods from the United States, during the last year, was \$108,486,016, being nine millions less than in 1835, and twenty millions less than in 1836. The value of the exports of domestic produce in 1836 was \$69,623,876, in 1835, \$65,064,414, and in 1834, \$61,016,680.

Comparing the years 1836 and 1835, we find at the chief fall-off: in the imports was in the following articles: 1836. 1835. Cotton goods, \$17,876,087. \$6,509,320. Woolen goods, 12,758,430. 9,812,538. Silk goods, 23,692,171. 9,812,538. Iron, 8,271,213. 3,853,449. Iron and Steel, 12,899,648. 8,418,504. Sugar, 12,514,712. 7,586,233. Rice, 5,531,211. 4,471,136. Flour, 4,232,924. 9,112,411. Wine, 1,212,924. 9,112,411.

This table exhibits in a striking light the effects of the expansion and contraction of the currency on the import trade. One article, molasses, seems not to have been affected by these changes in the currency. The value of that imported in 1836 was \$4,077,312, and in 1835 \$3,865,725.

The imports of sugar, molasses, and coffee, were, respectively, \$1,341,311, \$1,341,311, and \$1,341,311. The total value in 1836 was \$69,623,876, and in 1835 \$65,064,414, and in 1834 \$61,016,680.

The exports of cotton goods, woolen goods, silk goods, iron, iron and steel, sugar, rice, flour, wine, and other articles, were, respectively, \$17,876,087, \$12,758,430, \$23,692,171, \$8,271,213, \$12,899,648, \$12,514,712, \$5,531,211, \$4,232,924, \$1,212,924, and \$1,212,924.

The export of cotton goods of domestic manufacture in 1836 was \$3,758,765, against \$2,811,175 in 1835, and \$2,355,734 in 1834. The chief exports of domestic cotton in 1836, were to the following countries: China, \$532,097. British East Indies, 140,763. Dutch East Indies, 153,333. Manila, 70,311. Peru, 57,748. Chili, 640,831. Argentine Republic, 104,254. Brazil, 111,897. Mexico, 507,320. Cuba, 157,621. Cape De Verd Islands, 60,553. Turkey, Levant, &c., 111,897.

The following table exhibits the relative importance of our trade during the year 1835, with the following countries: Imports from Exports to Great Britain and dependencies, \$4,051,181. \$58,943,392. France and dependencies, 18,087,140. 16,252,413. Spain and dependencies, 15,971,394. 7,684,006. Netherlands and dependencies, 2,436,166. 3,772,206. Prussia, 3,500,769. 9,164,697. Prussia, 165,718. 1,247,880. With the same countries (omitting Texas) our trade was as follows in 1836:

In 1836 our imports from Great Britain were nearly thirty-seven millions less than in 1835, and from France nineteen millions. In 1836 the commercial balance was, as exhibited by the customhouse books, nearly twenty millions in favor of Great Britain. In 1835 the balance is nearly ten millions in favor of the United States.

In 1836 the balance in favor of France was nearly fifteen millions. In 1835 it was less than \$2 millions. The following exhibits the total value of the imports and exports of the States which were not deeply engaged in the foreign trade during the year 1836:

LATER FROM ENGLAND. The packet ship Siddons, at New York, brings Liverpool papers of the 14th June. Money was scarce, and the Bank of England was more sparing than ever in her discounts.

The prospect for the crops in Great Britain and Ireland, was good. The war between Turkey and Egypt is on the point of commencing. The Turkish army, 60,000 strong, have crossed the Euphrates at Bir.

The greatest consternation prevails in Egypt. The troops of the Dey have passed on through Alexandria by forced marches, to join Ibrahim Pacha, who with his generals and army is at Aleppo, awaiting the approach of the Sultan's troops.

INVASION OF TEXAS BY MEXICO. The N. O. American credits the rumors of an intended invasion of Texas by Mexico, and says, it has information of a credible character, which justifies that belief. We place but little reliance in the report to the extent which it now goes, but we deem it probable that the subjugation of Texas by Mexico may be undertaken, though, we believe, it will not be accomplished.

Centenary of Methodism. The present year, being the first centenary of Methodism, is celebrated as such by the followers of Wesley throughout the world. In England, more than a million of children had been contributed as a thank-offering, at the last accounts, and a much larger sum is anticipated during the year.

Crops in North Alabama. The North Alabamaian says, "Several fresh-fallen showers during the past week—crops walking ahead—corn in the tassels—cotton blossoms plenty—Wheat harvest—crops never more abundant—occasional blackberry."

Fire in Farmville. We had a large fire here last night, which burned some nine or ten houses, just in the centre of the business part of the town, which spoils the looks of the town.

Accident to Mr. Clay. The Cincinnati Gazette of the 9th inst. says:—"We learn that the stage in which Mr. Clay was passenger upset on Saturday, near Palmyra, O., and that he was slightly injured. Another passenger had his leg broken in his fall. Mr. Clay has several times narrowly escaped with his life from the upsetting of stage coaches."

A parcel of prime Md. new red was sold at \$4.25 and one of Virginia at the same price, for the same destination. The city millers appear not disposed to give these prices.
