GENERAL INTELLIGENCE.

IMPORTANT NEWS FROM MEXICO.—New Orleans, May 21, 1839. By the schooner *Water Witch*, which sailed from Vera Cruz on the 5th inst., intelligence has been received of an important victory over the cause of Federalism. Our only hope is that it may turn out to be a false rumor. On the 6th inst., an express reached Vera Cruz from the interior, bringing information that a pitched battle had been fought in the neighborhood of Puebla, between the forces of the Government and the Federalists, in which the latter sustained a total defeat with immense loss, followed by the dispersion of their forces. General Mexico, it is said, was captured and after wards shot by order of Santa Ana. The two other leaders in the insurrection, Generals Urrea and Escalada, effected their escape.
