That paper states: "For some weeks past the great national highway has been literally crowded with the wagons, horses, mules, and all the paraphernalia of emigration. Both the ferries across the Washah at this point are kept going from daylight until a late hour at night, frequently passing as many as 100 wagons per day. From a recent trip north of this place, we learn that there are upwards of 500 emigrants in a large degree, to all the main thoroughfares to the great West."
