WHIG ADDRESS TO THE PEOPLE OF VIRGINIA, [CONCLUDED.] RECEPTION OF THE LAND MONEY.

RECEPTION OF THE LAND MONEY, On the 4th of December, 1844, Mr. Garnett of Essex, in conformity with what was known by the Whig sentiment throughout the Commonwealth, submitted the following resolution for the reception of Virginia's Share of the Land Fund.

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THE report of the majority concluded with the following resolution: Resolved, That the Senate concur in the Resolution of the House of Delegates.

THE Whigs of Virginia, we propose to address a word of encouragement and invocation to the Whigs of Virginia, by the result of the Presidential election.

IT is deemed somewhat singular that the party now objecting to the distribution of the Land Fund, on the ground (in the language of the Majority Report) that Congress has no power to bestow upon the States the Treasury of the Union.

THE Whigs believe Virginia to be properly entitled to her share of the Land Fund, and, believing, they will not permit themselves to be divided.
