By the arrival of the steamer Fashion... At New Orleans, we have news from Vera Cruz up to the 20th ult.

LATEST FROM VERA CRUZ.

Deaths from Yellow Fever.—Reignation of Santa Anna—its Acceptance Refused.—Rumored Messengers at Puebla untrue.—Fortifying the Capital.

Col. Sowers, bearer of despatches from the Government to Gen. Scott has been murdered, with an escort of Lieutenant McDonnell and seven men, by a band of robbers.

General Shields is doing well, we are most happy to hear, and was shortly expected at Vera Cruz.

Among the passengers in the Fashion, are Lieuts. Morry, Kane and Fellengange, and James Johnson, Quartermaster's Sergeant of the Pennsylvania regiment with forty sick and recovered invalids.

The diligence does not run between this and the city of Mexico, and so far I have found it impossible to lay my hands upon any papers.

THE RIO FRIO PASS.

This pass will now become the great point of interest, as it is evident, the enemy intend to make a stand there, and that we shall have another severe battle.

From here I have nothing worthy of notice to communicate except that yesterday Santa Anna resigned the presidency, but it is not known yet whether Congress will admit it.
