

Important News from Mexico.

No Prospect of an early Peace—Gen. Scott on the march for the Capital—Santa Anna with an Army of 22,000—Another route of Guerrillas—Total destruction of Santa Fe.

The U. S. steamer Massachusetts, arrived at Vera Cruz on the 27th ult., with advices from Vera Cruz to the 23d.

It is supposed that the forces under Gen. Scott number about 15,000 troops. Santa Fe, a small village near Vera Cruz, had been entirely burned down by order of Gen. Wilson.

Gen. Pierce, who left Vera Cruz with 3,000 men, had encountered and put to rout a large body of guerrillas. The killed among the Mexicans is said to be very large and only a few Americans killed and wounded.

It is believed that Gen. Pierce will have formed a junction with Gen. Scott before the latter had attacked the city of Mexico.

A letter in the Times, dated Vera Cruz, July 20, says: In my hurried note of the 17th I informed you of the destruction of our hopes with regard to peace, and of the report that Gen. Scott had fixed upon the 15th instant for his march upon the Capital.
