PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE
The Constitution requires that the President shall, from time to time, give to Congress a report on the state of the Union, and recommend such measures as he may judge necessary and expedient.

The condition of the domestic institutions of the Union, its agriculture, mines, manufactures, navigation, and commerce, it is necessary only to say that the internal prosperity of the country, its confidence and its peace, are well advanced.
