THE CANAL. Gov. KING, of New York, and two of the Canal Commissioners, attended by several prominent citizens, have been making an experiment on the enlarged portion of the Erie Canal, to test the practicability of the use of steam as a propelling power without injury to the walls or banks of the Canal.

Mr. Ruggles one of the Commissioners, addressed the people.
