ONE DAY LATER FROM EUROPE.

New York, July 11. The steamer City of Baltimore and Adelsville sailed this morning, bringing dates from Europe to the 30th of June one day later than the advance recently received.

The London Times contains some further particulars with regard to the great battle of Solferino, though full details have not been received.

The Paris correspondent of the Times says that Gen. Noy's 72,000 men, and 30,000 men of French cavalry in all about 100,000 men, were engaged until 1 o'clock P. M. when he succeeded in forcing the Austrians to retreat after twelve hours hard fighting.

The Austrians had brought up their force of 80,000, and the 18th of June, 1859, to the number of 50,000. It was a most critical moment, but in three hours more the general fighting ended to the advantage of the allies.

The Zouaves are said to have been much cut up on the first day of the battle. Heavily treated four Generals were wounded and one killed. Some idea of the number of wounded may be formed from the fact that 14,000 beds were commandeered at Milan for the accommodation of the wounded.

The Piedmontese Gazette dated Turin, June 27, publishes the official details of the battle which took place on the evening and morning of the 24th and 25th of June, 1859.

According to positive information, 25,000 Austrians held their ground at Solferino. A French officer who occupied the formidable position from which they were dislodged by the Austrians under the direction of the late King Victor Emmanuel. The loss of the Austrians is said to be at least 10,000 men, and the same number of wounded.
