



INAUGURAL ADDRESS.

Fellow Citizens of the United States: In compliance with a custom so old as the government itself, I appear before you to address you briefly and to take, in your presence, the oath prescribed by the constitution of the United States, to be taken by the President before he enters on the execution of his office.

It follows, from these views, that no State, upon its own mere motion, can lawfully get out of the Union—that resolves, and ordinances to that effect are legally void, and that acts of violence within any State or States against the authority of the United States are treasonary or revolutionary, according to circumstances.
